

My World – Reception Activity Grid – Autumn 1 Term

Please try and complete one activity from the grid in order to support your child's learning. We encourage our children to bring in any completed activities or photos of them on the last week of term to share with their class. Alternatively, parents have the option to share any of their child's completed activities through videos or photos via Evidence Me.

Please note: Children are still required to read for at least 10 minutes per day regardless of the reading stage they are at.


Literacy:

Go on a nature walk and talk about what sounds you can hear and where the sounds are coming from. Can you segment and blend the words for things you can see e.g. l-ea-f = leaf, t-r-ee = tree. Also, can you practise the letters s, a, t, p, i and n.



Personal, Social and Emotional/Communication and Language:

Make your own soup! Work with an adult to follow a recipe for vegetable soup. Discuss what healthy ingredients are in your soup and how to be safe when in the kitchen. You can record yourself and upload to Evidence Me or take a picture of your finished soup!



Expressive Arts and Design:

Whilst you are out on a walk, collect some different coloured leaves and sticks. Can you use them to create your own reindeer? Upload your picture to Evidence Me or bring it into school!



Mathematics:

Use real life objects in both your home and the outside world to find one more and one less and consolidate counting from 0-10.

You can also go on a shape hunt, what shapes can you see and name? Upload any pictures/videos to Evidence Me.



Physical Development:

When you are out and about practise your jumping, running, crawling, climbing and balancing skills. Get your grown up to record you practising these skills and upload to Evidence Me as a parent postcard e.g. jumping in puddles, walking across a small wall.



Understanding the World:

Go on an Autumn/Winter walk and discuss with your grown up all about what you have learnt in school about the different seasons. Can you talk about what the words 'hibernation' and 'nocturnal' mean?
