Upload any pictures of any activities you do onto Evidence Me for your child's teacher to see.


Please note: Children are still advised to listen to a story with a family member at least once a day. Ask your child questions about the story and discuss the pictures in stories to promote imagination and to develop communication and language skills.

Literacy:

Road & River Tracing: Draw different paths, roads, or rivers for your child to trace with crayons, markers, or finger in sand.

Talk about:

"Can you follow the wiggly road?" "Can you make the circle path go around the hill?" "Which way does the river flow? (left to right)"



Personal, Social and Emotional/Communication and Language:

People Who Help Us: Use dolls, figures, or dress-up to act out roles like pilot, bus driver, or nurse.

Talk about:

"What does a pilot do?" "Who helps us when we are ill?" "How do we thank people who help us?"



Expressive Arts and Design:

Travel Music & Instruments: Make "vehicles" sounds with household items (shakers for trains, drums for planes).

Talk about:

"Can you make the train sound?" "How does the plane sound?" "Which is loudest?"



Mathematics:

Travel Dice Game (Number Recognition)

Activity:

Pick a small toy. Make a path of counters (real counters or cut out circles)

Roll a dice and identify the amount/number.

Move the object along the path of counters the amount shown on the die. E.g. number 5, then move across the path counting 1 at a time until you get to 5.

Repeat until you get to the end of the path of counters.

Talk About:

"How many spaces should we move?"

"Can you count all the vehicles?"

"Which number comes next?"



Physical Development:

Travel Dance Moves: Play music and move like different modes of transport (airplane, train, boat, car). Example below.

Talk about:

"Can you flap your wings like a plane?" "Which way does the train turn?" "How fast can the boat move?"



Understanding the World:

"What is different here?" "What would you pack for this place?" "Who lives there?"
